Just a quarter in the morning and a quarter in the evening is all you have to do. At the end of each month, send those quarters to the Summit Masonic Complex and then start each month anew. A quarter in the morning and a quarter in the evening, it is just that simple

Let us do the numbers. We have approximately 3,000 members that now meet in the Summit Masonic Complex. Let's say 75%, or 2250, members participate. For each of our carrying members, twenty-five cents in the morning and twenty-five cents in the evening equals \$3.50 per week, or less that the cost of one gallon of gas for your car. Now let's multiply this modest amount by our 2250 members. At the end of the year we will have raised \$409,500. This amount plus the funds already collected or pledged will reduce the mortgage from \$912,000 to only \$352,000. One quarter at a time.

All contributions to **"Can You Spare Me a Quarter"** will be kept separate from any other donations and will be applied to a separate account insuring that they will not be used for any other purpose. They will be registered in each of your names so we have an accurate total of each contributing member. If every Blue Lodge member and every Scottish Rite member participates in **"Can You Spare Me a Quarter"** we can reach the goal which our Fraternity has struggled with the last three years, financial security for the Summit Masonic Complex. The **"Can You Spare Me a Quarter"** program can establish a legacy, that we can all be proud, but only if we all participate. **Will you participate?**
